Father Luther Diaz, one of the six, will be assigned to our parish as associate pastor (parochial vicar) for a three year term beginning July 1. Fr. BEWARE! CYBERSCAMMERS TARGETING SCHOOLS AND PARISHES IN THE ARCHDIOCESE – The

Archdiocese has been notified that some parishioners at several parishes including our parish have received scam text messages requesting personal information, money and gift cards. These messages appear to be sent from the parish or a priest at the parish, which is part of the scam. These scams are called phishing – when someone uses fake emails, texts or calls to get you to share valuable personal information, like account numbers, Social Security numbers, or your login IDs and passwords. It is important for our community of faith to know that they would never receive a text message from a parish or priest requesting personal information, money and gift cards.

MONTH OF THE SACRED HEART – Each year the month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus (just as May is dedicated to Mary, October to the Rosary, November to the Souls in Purgatory, etc.) Each First Friday of the month is also dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Each year the Church celebrates a "moveable feast" of the Sacred Heart, this year on June 28. This month provides us with a special time to reflect on the unconditional love of the Heart of Jesus for each of us. This is a special time to give thanks for that love and to make reparation for the sins that offend our Lord.

OPEN ENROLLMENT – This is the time of year in which our Parish School holds open enrollment for new students. Our parish school provides the finest Catholic elementary education in our community. If you are interested in enrolling your child, please stop by the school office as soon as possible as spaces are limited.

MOTHER OF PERPETUAL HELP FIRST WEDNESDAY MASS THIS WEEK – Each Wednesday during the past Lent we prayed the Novena to Our Mother of Perpetual Help and celebrated the Mass. The attendance ranged from 35 on March 27 to 92 on April 17. The Novena will continue to be prayed each Wednesday at 6:30 pm. For the present time we will add the celebration of the Mass after the novena prayers on the First Wednesday of the month. These dates include the following: June 5, July 3, August 7, September 4, etc.

FIRST FRIDAY MASSES THIS WEEK – On the First Friday of each month we have the usual weekday 6:30am and 8:00am Masses in English in the morning and we add a bilingual Mass at 7:00pm. The Blessed Sacrament is exposed on the altar after the evening Mass until 10:00pm. The first hour is a silent Holy Hour followed by reflections and prayers in Spanish beginning at 9:00pm. Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament takes place about 9:50pm.

FATHERS' DAY – June 16 is Fathers' Day. We will have a special blessing for all fathers at each Mass. A wonderful gift for your father (or grandfather or Godfather or brother, etc.) would be a remembrance in our annual Novena of Masses. The special cards will be available in baskets below the tabernacle next weekend.

OUR BIBLICAL DUTY – In the month of June we "wind down" with the end of the school year and the end of Religious Education classes. This is also a time, sadly, when our weekly collection might take a down turn. The summer months tend to be "lean" with the collection yet our expenses remain the same or actually go up due to the repairs made in the summer. Ask yourself, what can you purchase with one dollar these days? Yet that is still the average donation given at many parishes on Sunday. Meanwhile our expenses, including power, water, insurance, etc., continue to rise steadily.

The Bible tells us that our duty is different. Our duty is to give to God the "first fruits" of our labor. This means 10% of our ordinary income should be returned to God by way of our donations. Many people divide it by giving 5% to the parish and the other 5% to other charities such as Together in Mission and the second collections we occasionally have for the Missions, etc. Please prayerfully consider how much you give back to God each week.

HAVE YOU REMEMBERED THE CHURCH IN YOUR WILL? – Statistics show that a sizeable portion of people die without a will each day. Many of those people have

no heirs. As a result, their entire estate simply goes to the government. Sadly, many of those people were active parishioners in their local churches yet they never thought to leave behind a legacy which could keep their memory alive for many years to come.

Ask yourself these questions: a) Have I written down my desires regarding my funeral? b) Have I written down how I want my money to be distributed upon my death? c) Have I remembered my parish in these plans?

Our parish church is our second home. It is our spiritual home. We should provide for it so that it is here in the future to serve the generations which follow us.

Remember: making no plan is actually making a decision to allow the state to make the decisions for you. Is that what you want or would you rather make these decisions yourself?

While the parish's ordinary expenses are paid from ordinary income (collection), large projects such as major repairs and improvements can only be paid from savings which accrue over time. These savings depend on the generosity of parishioners who leave their homes or other property to the church. Please prayerfully consider the parish when making your estate planning decisions. May God reward you for your generosity!

DID YOU KNOW - What constitutes a concern worth reporting? Parents have a responsibility to report concerns they have about another person's behaviors or actions that could put their children — or any children — at risk. These concerns are anything that makes the parent uneasy or uncomfortable, or anything that a child reports made them feel uneasy or uncomfortable. Some examples of seemingly little things that can be worth reporting include: A teacher covering her glass classroom door with artwork, eliminating the ability to see into the classroom from the hall; a youth ministry icebreaker activity, where teens have to pass a mint candy from person to person using only toothpicks in their mouth, despite the discomfort of some participants.
